Since many of our teachers are mothers who have children with special needs they bring an insightful worldview. Given their personal growth journeys that reflects an empathetic approach and strong intent to transform lives of the children they are entrusted with. This involves engaging multiple stakeholders - our alumni students, families, volunteers, funders, local communities, civil society friends work in our space i.e. PwD. We continue to advocate and provide consultations with the Dept of Health, Education, Welfare, and DifferentlyAble to amplify the issues of access to physical environment, products that are universally accessible and processes that are navigable for PwD. We consistently work towards change in media representation, the school management leadership, general education teachers, and work places.

The past year we have carried out a number of renovation activities in Taramani branch duly supported by Coronis Ajuba Solutions Pvt. Ltd and Synamedia Pvt Ltd. Similarly we have elevated the Administration building by about 3 feet to protect it from rain damage. WE have installed solar system in our Taramani branch which is awaiting EB meter clearance. This will go a long way in saving electricity bill.

#### From Restless Beginnings to Remarkable Achievements – CBR

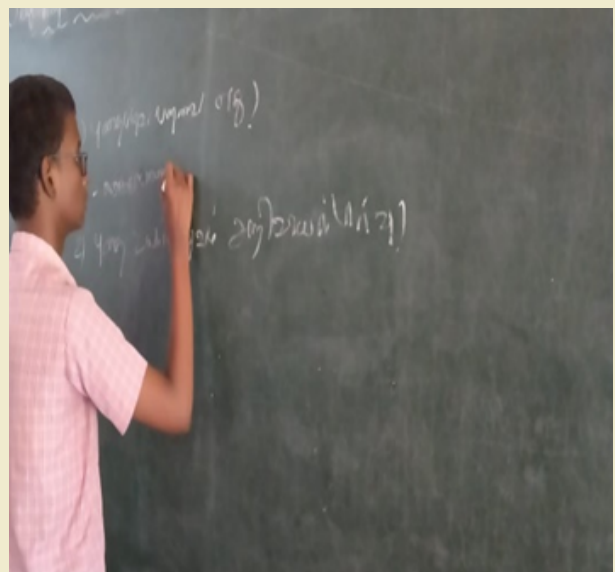
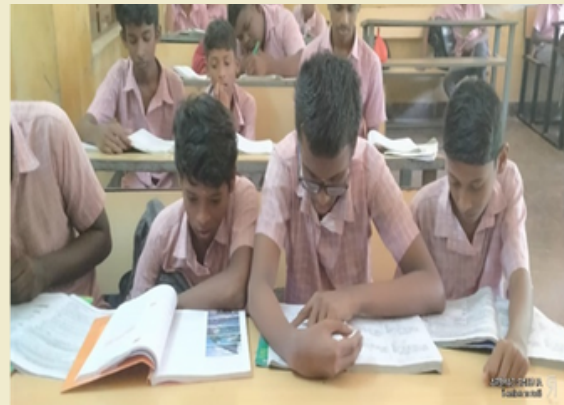


Praveen arrived at SPASTN Redhills CBR center at five, full of energy and unable to focus or make eye contact.

He learned weaving, housekeeping, diya painting, and block printing very quickly. He took part in many competitions, which helped him become more confident and improve his social skills. Because of his responsibility, he was made the Food Committee in-charge, where he learned to be punctual and travel on his own. Today, Hari works at Writers Café, Taramani, as a helper in the baking unit and is proud to have achieved his dream of having a job and being independent

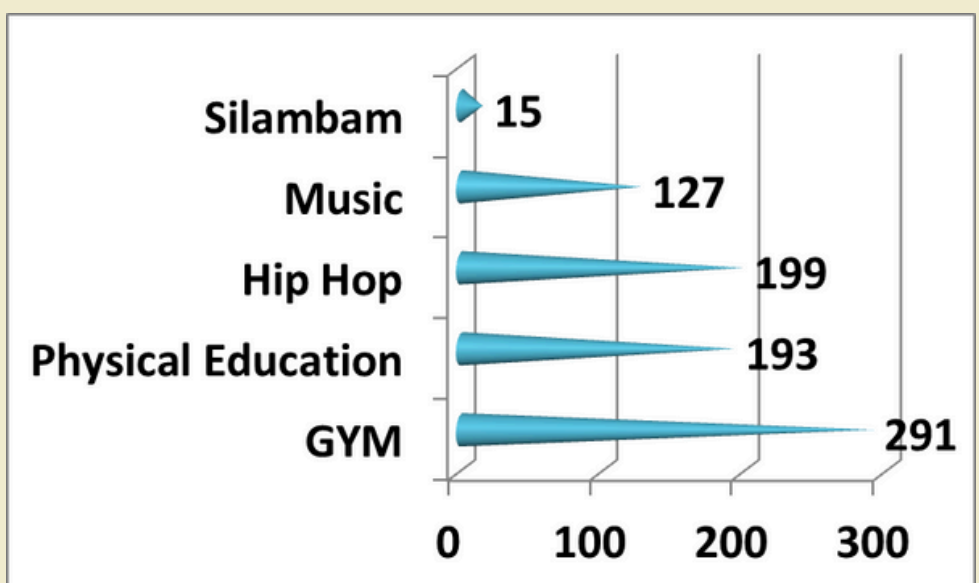


## Early Intervention & Newborn Screening

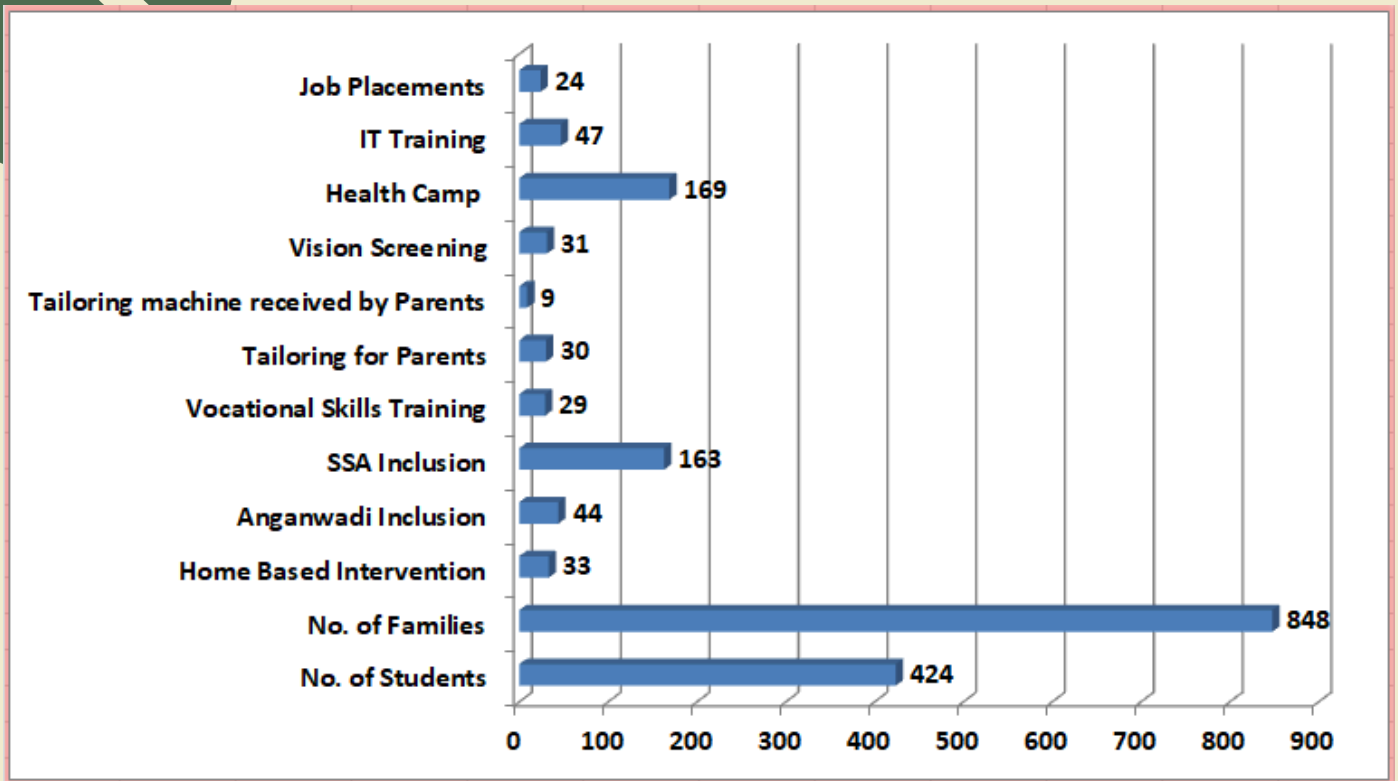

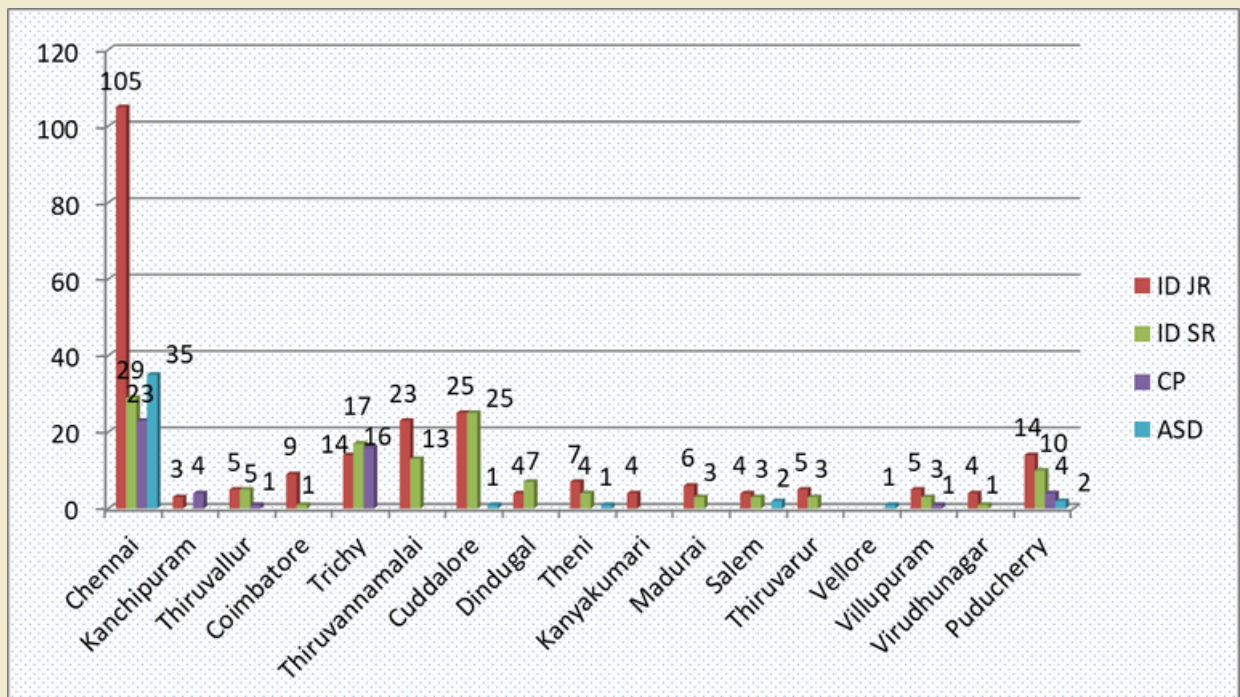

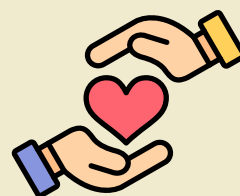
