SPASTN's work empowers people with disabilities to determine their own aspirational pathway and contribute to the economic, social and cultural advancement of their community, as equals in society.

he year 1981 was proclaimed as the International Year of Disabled Persons by the United Nations General Assembly. It called for action towards equalization of opportunities, rehabilitation and prevention of disabilities.

Inspired by these thoughts, Mrs. Shanthi Sadiq Ali, wife of the then-Governor of Tamil Nadu, along with some friends and philanthropists, started The Spastics Society of Tamilnadu [SPASTN] to address the needs of children with cerebral palsy and multiple disabilities.

Soon after, the first school was started in a room loaned by the C.P. Ramaswamy lyer Foundation in central Chennai. It had 10 students and 2 teachers, with special classes for children with cerebral palsy.


Today, over **30 years** since it was founded, SPASTN serves about 1300 persons with disabilities everymonth. Its 3 special schools in South (Taramani), Central (Ayanavaram)

and North (Royapuram) Chennai provide extensive rehabilitation programs, including neuro-developmental therapy, hydrotherapy, speech & language therapy and sensory integration. SPASTN also runs a Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR) program in Thiruvallur District.

SPASTN is the State Nodal Agency Centre of The National Trust, Government of India.

Adopting an innovative approach of being both cost and reach effective, SPASTN builds the capacities skills of government officials from the departments of Health, Education, Public Welfare, Transport, Judiciary, Rural Development, the Police and NGO personnel, through sensitization, training and awareness campaigns within and across countries. This has resulted in strong linkages with the State & Central Government departments, University hospitals, educational institutions and NGOs, within India and the world over Sri Lanka, Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Nepal, Kenya, Canada, United Kingdom & Australia, to name a few.

SPASTN advocates the rights of persons with disabilities, so that they can seamlessly and effortlessly gain access to life, to information, to education, to employment, to social security and to full participation.



Prevention Over the last 2 decades, thanks to SPASTN's newborn-screening facility, over 1,25,000 infants, who are at risk, were identified. This service is available free of cost at various government hospitals in Chennai/Thiruvallur. These children stand a better chance of limiting the impact of disability in their lives because of early intervention.

Inclusion As an early mover to embrace and promote the Right to Education for all, SPASTN sensitized and built capacities in the education system, of families and communities to create an enabling environment for enrollment and retention of students with disability in regular schools. SPASTN has placed over 15000 children in regular schools till date. A number of students are pursuing tertiary programs in city colleges in varied fields like Culinary Art, Visual Communication, Psychology, Business

Administration and entering the world of work.

Rehabilitation Through its dedicated team of special educators, therapists, visual and performance art teachers, SPASTN provides multidisciplinary holistic intervention programs. By developing individualized educational plans, this manages physical impairment while optimizing learning and mobility. SPASTN's placement efforts via community-based vocational training has placed over a hundred students in open employment.

The world today adapts and accepts the person for what he or she is. SPASTN's children have transformed from being beneficiaries of charity to acquiring knowledge and skills so that they can participate in the community without barriers.

The two interlinked hands which form the logo signifies the linkage between persons with disabilities, their families and organizations (government, corporate and NGOs), working together. Networking and multi-sectorial linkages form the axis around which SPASTN revolves.
