

TREASURER'S REPORT

Ladies and Gentlemen,

The audited financial statements have already been presented to you. And now I have pleasure in presenting the Treasurer's Report for the year 2020-21.

As in the past, SPASTN had during the year, continued its activities to fulfill its objectives despite the numerous challenges being faced. SPASTN in common with other organisations has had to learn to adapt and be relevant in the face of challenges that it had not experienced before. While, 2020-21 is the second year of COVID-19 and probably has prepared SPASTN to face it better as compared to the year 2019-20, each year has thrown up unique challenges. Once again, SPASTN has been able to keep its head above the waters mainly thanks to the generous support received from philanthropists. As we go forward into the year 2021-22, we are still unable to say when the country or for that matter the rest of the world will be in a position to say that COVID-19 is behind us. Therefore it behoves us to act with caution and yet not ease up on the objectives for which SPASTN was set up.

As stated in the earliers's reports, the support from the government is dwindling both on the fiscal side and on the attention we have been getting. It should be noted that SPASTN had not received any amounts from the Government during the year and yet managed to keep up the good work to the extent permitted by the general environment and conditions under which the movements and logistical support have been restricted.

Word of appreciation

A special word of appreciation must be spoken for the **Therapeutic Enrichment Activity Hall-Research & Development [TEACH (R&D)] project** which has been funded by many donors. The year 2020-21 saw the project being completed in all respects, capitalised in the books of account and is now available for the use for which it was intended. We must acknowledge the support we have received from Madras Round Table [MRT] No.1 Charitable Trust, Social Welfare, Centre Johan Maasbach World Mission, Chennai, and Chennai Willingdon Corporate Foundation, Chennai . The contribution of MRT 1 till date had aggregated to a sum of Rs.1,27,50,000. We would like to thank all of the donors for their support for the Project TEACH R&D. As already mentioned the auditorium is now fully functional although we have not been able to generate any resources out of it for the obvious reasons of limitation on holding meetings.

Challenges facing SPASTN in the current year

We have been aware of the challenges facing SPASTN for sometime now. They are worth repeating here for all those who hold SPASTN dear to their hearts. As already discussed in the meeting of the Executive Committee, these are as follows:

- (1) There is virtually no support from the Government for the activities. One notices that there is now generally a visible fatigue associated with giving donations since the causes that require support have been steadily going up.;
- (2) The auditorium has not started generating any income. Presently, the maintenance costs are running at about a lakh of rupees per month.
- (3) Support from the corporate sector by way of Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) is beginning to dwindle on account of the money being diverted to government supported projects with SPASTN having to compete with the government for the funds;
- (4) Interest earned from deposits is about Rs. 40 lakhs per year. There has been gradual reduction in rates of interest over the years. There are some indications that the rates of interest will go up in a year's time though the increased rates may not reach the earlier rates.
- (5) Further, the proportion of interest on deposits to total income of SPASTN is about 17% for the year (13% in 2020) which indicates that as a charitable organisation SPASTN's income is skewed by way of reliance on external sources over which we have no control. Usually, in charitable organisations the income from deposits is more than 60% indicating a greater control over income and activities.

Grateful Acknowledgements

On behalf of SPASTN I would like to express our sincere appreciation and thanks to the donors for the donations which have kept the activities of SPASTN going and for their encouragement when needed most.

In conclusion, I would also like to thank and acknowledge the services to SPASTN by the dedicated team of the Director and the Staff of SPASTN. There are no words to describe their commitment.

Last but not the least, my thanks to the President of SPASTN, the members of the Executive Committee who have spent their time and given their wise counsel in administering SPASTN.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT



Dear friends and supporters of SPASTN!

Looking back at the year in review I can only honestly confess that to navigate the year required me to alternate between keeping my foot both on the break and the pedal. The reason being the year was indeed very unprecedented, uncertain, complex and ambiguous. Many of our donors and some of our CSR project funds were diverted to Covid Care.

All these years we have been working both with our head and heart but nothing really prepared us for the onset of Covid-19 pandemic. Our resources was stretched and at the same time we need to work on a plan to stay connected with our families, students, and engage them to know how they were coping with loss of income. So our first responder approach was to try and reach food rations programs for very vulnerable families. We reached out to donors, other Civil Society Organizations and friends to support besides food rations also to provide for medication especially for epilepsy. We have no words to THANK all the Donors.

Our limits was stretched but hour resilience, imagination and creativity also rose up to the challenge. We had to ramp our technological skills and harness it for learning, carry out teletherapy, our teachers and therapists rose to these challenges amazingly. Home-based Learning turned into golden opportunities to uncover new abilities in our students and many caregivers became active partners in their children's learning and therapy. The individualized family-centered work came in handy as our parents were involved closely in the therapy and learning of their child during pre-Covid times.

Many parents shared how they discovered their children's interests and strengths through these sessions. We also witnessed our colleagues supporting one another in solidarity or typing weekly reports as our teachers did not own anything beyond a low-mid range smart phones.

Our collective efforts amid these challenging times testify to the strong sense of purpose behind all that we do at SPASTN. Whenever there was a window when lockdown restrictions were lifted we tried to organize camps for assistive devices as many children had overgrown some their own devices.

Even though we ended the last financial year with uncertainties brought on by the pandemic, we are determined not to let that overshadow the work we have accomplished in the last year. We have made great strides in our mission of empowering our clients and supporting them to thrive in inclusive communities, and in this year's annual report, we share with you some of these highlights as you read forward.

REPORT FROM CENTRE BASED AND COMMUNITY BASED PROGRAMMES

Year 2020 April as it unfolded it was challenging for all of us as Coronavirus was affecting all of us in more than one way.

The COVID-19 pandemic has worsened access to education and therapy for Children with Disabilities (CwD). Covid-19 has hugely amplified the various barriers that persons with disability and their families face. Barriers are economic, social, education, therapy intervention, access to assistive devices, digital access, technology tools etc.

Education for Children is critical and Remote Learning is the key linkage to stay connected, and stay engaged with our beneficiaries SO THAT THEY DO NOT SLIP OUT OF THE SYSTEM.

Our children are from socially disadvantaged families where every Rupee is a trade-off between placing food on the plate and to stay engaged with Special Educators and Therapists through Remote Learning. Family and child centered service delivery that SPASTN follows came in handy as parents were part of intervention and so were able to carry out working with their children at home with teacher and therapy guidance.

The challenge of staying connected and staying engaged is exacerbated by Digital Exclusion as many families do not have any access to devices to benefit from Online Education.

Positive Outcomes of the new challenges post Covid and lockdown:


- SPASTN's "moolamantra" from April onwards was for teachers / therapists to
 - Stay Connected with our families
 - Stay engaged to pick up any red flags with families are experiencing coping and to address their fears
 - Maintain Routines both for families and for our teachers
- Less is more how to optimize on household equipments for teaching learning and therapy as families converted areas within home as therapy spaces and learning space.
- Parents become intervenors / teachers and surprised us as many became intuitive practitioners
- Family and child centered service delivery where parents have been part of education and therapy paid off during Covid Lockdown
- The Connection and Engagement helped us to ramp up practical assistance of food rations and medicines sourced through network of donors, social service organizations and State Government supported initiatives
- Teachers and teacher fraternity in SPASTN took a deep dive into exploring the various ICT tools. Each teacher helped other teachers in skilling and acing the technology
- Therapists extended services/consultancy to parents as many developed issues of caregiving including back care issues
- Therapy videos sent by parents was analysed to make corrections
- To overcome social isolation we started group therapy that included 4-5 students for children. Circle time and fun activities was carried out.
- Theme based activities were introduced where parents used resources available at home
- Multi-Level of support between and among teachers and therapists.
- SPASTN through CSR Projects / Corporate donations was able to get Laptops for teachers

- For families provided tablets for some children, supported others with netpacks through CSR Projects.
- Online timing was adjusted by teachers based on the smart phone availability for the student.
- Teachers and the therapy fraternity developed a visual resources based on age group of the students:
 - Stories
 - PowerPoint with interactive component
 - Recreation videos for older students Hiphop Zumba based on popular Tamil numbers
 - Cooking videos for Vocational training
- Our Staff whose only exposure was whattsapp gradually moved on Google Meet / Zoom interactive board / white Board etc
- Teachers also used the time to attend to number of webinars to enhance their professional practice
- Linkage with Government and Social Organisations
- When a window opened we had Assistive Device camps with the support from social service institutions
- Parents trust us, used innovation to device therapy equipment with resources available at home and were determined to achieve outcomes for the child
- Whenever lockdown was opened in a limited and graded manner we encouraged oneto-one work so that teachers and therapists could measure the CLOP.
- Few children who had made remarkable progress during lockdown as we believe some variables that may have worked is
 - o Very motivated mothers who followed both educational and therapy routines
 - o Time available with families as travel time and effort had reduced
 - Nature also may have played its parts us regard to bio behavioural pattern falling into rhythm

Challenges:

- Some children could not be part of online due to various sensory/motor and neuro issues and such parents appealed to us to come in person so that the child does not miss out
- Parental fatigue of managing Online both for child with disability and child attending regular schools
- Overcoming Digital Exclusion Many families who were newly unemployed moved to their home towns. The button phones were the only mode of connection.
- Ways to provide support families who were grieving for loss ofloved one
- We notice many of our clients have some adverse effects in terms of learning loss in literacy and numeracy, communication. This become apparent during ormative evaluation. We realized many children did not have underpinning knowledge so criterion of mastery was not achieved.
- Families with adolescent students experienced challenges of problem behaviours
- During the Delta wave many children we lost in SPASTN. We had organized webinars forour teachers a counseling






No. of Students reached through Online and Direct sessions by Special Schools, Vocational Training Centre and Community Based Rehabilitation Programmes







Highlights:



- Out of 9 trainees, 3 got job as special educators. Two are serving in the organisation which sponsored them. One trainee has become the in charge of a rural Rehabilitation centre.

Kumaran, M.Sc., M.Phil Psychologists with cerebral palsy, shared his inspirational stories from his life and the challenges he faced and how he tackled them effectively. 


