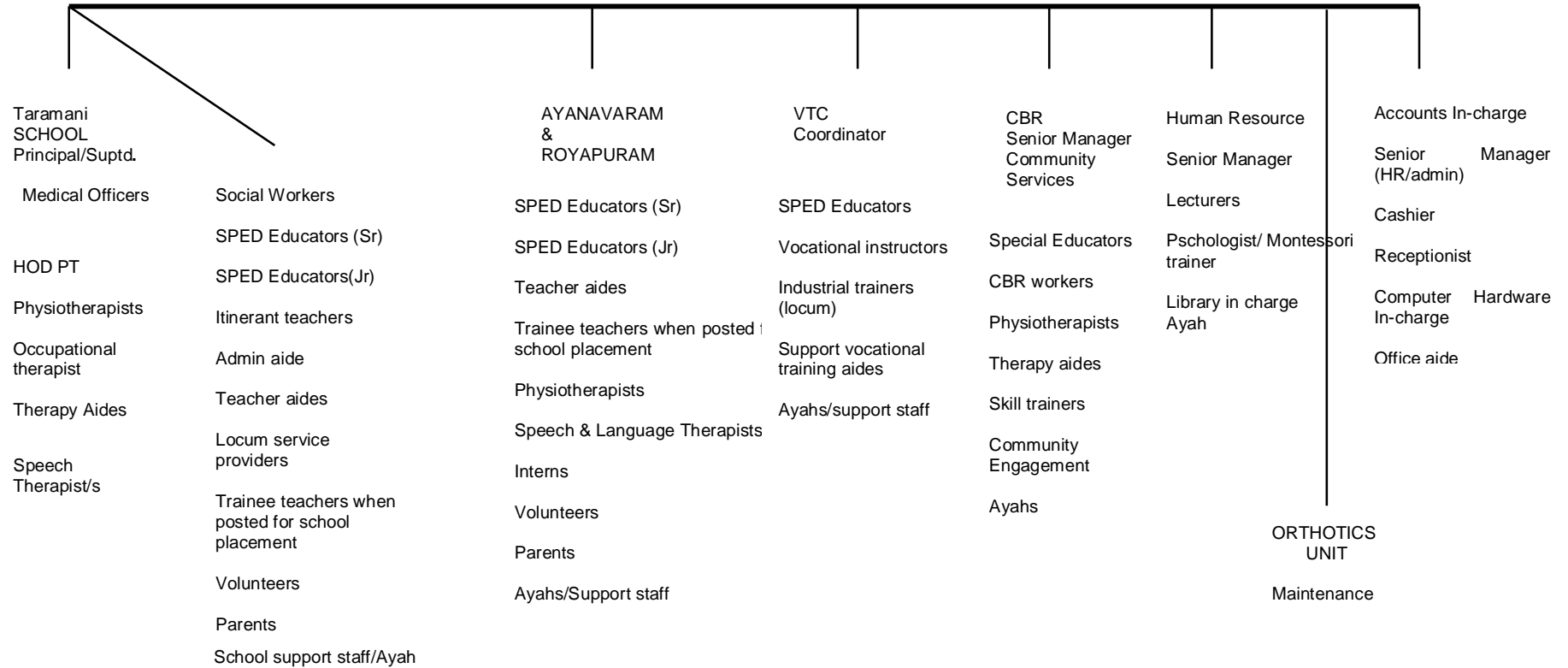

TREASURER'S REPORT

Ladies and gentlemen,

The financial statements for the year 2021-22 have already been presented to you and now I present to you the Treasurer's Report for the year 2021-22.

You will recall that in the report for the year 2020-21, I had dealt at length the challenges faced by us at SPASTN. While the two years of the pandemic had been painful in terms of loss of lives and the misery faced by all populations all over the globe, they had also taught us to be resilient and face the adversities squarely. Inevitably, the financial position of SPASTN in common with many other organisations including other NGOs and charitable organisations had suffered. We are still unable to say when the country or for that matter the rest of the world will be in a position to say that COVID-19 is behind us. A small mercy is that, in some countries, COVID-19 is no longer reckoned to be a pandemic but is now considered an endemic. As we continue to grapple with COVID-19 and its variants, it behoves us to act with caution and yet not ease up on the objectives for which SPASTN was set up.

The financial results continues to be in deficit. I present below a summary of the financial results:

While the results indicate that the operations of SPASTN have resulted in a deficit, one silver lining is that, as can be seen, in the current year under review i.e. 2021-22, both income and expenditure have gone up compared to the previous year indicating that SPASTN is more or less fully operational now.

As stated in the earlier year's report, the support from the government has been dwindling over the years both on the fiscal side and on the attention that we have been getting. It should be noted that SPASTN had not received any financial support from the Government during the year under review and yet managed to keep up the good work. It is probable that in the current year i.e. the year 2022-23, SPASTN will be fully functional and therefore it is all the more essential that we bestow our full attention to the financial viability of SPASTN. Almost all the financial constraints that I had been highlighting in the past few years continue to hinder us.

Although the full potential is yet to be achieved, the receipts from the vocational training programme related auditorium i.e. Therapeutic Enrichment Activity Hall - Research & Development [TEACH (R&D)] is beginning to show improvement. Hopefully, there will be more activity on this front resulting in some revenue being generated which will at least generate sufficient income to meet the annual maintenance costs.

The general condition of the economy continues to be bullish with the indications of some increase in the rate of interest on deposits. There is a need for SPASTN to mobilise resources that would give us a permanent source of income by way of interest income. As reported in the previous year's report, the proportion of interest on deposits to total income is low and is 15% in the current year compared to 17% in the previous year. This indicates that as a charitable organisation SPASTN's income is skewed by way of excessive reliance on external sources over which we have no control.

Looking at the state of economy, we should be optimistic that industry and commerce will boom and that the corporate sector will look at philanthropy both within the framework of Corporate Social Responsibility and in general as its obligation to the society at large. The emphasis on ESG (Environment, Social and Governance) which has received a lot of attention recently will hopefully garner more funds and assistance to SPASTN.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT



I believe that SPASTN's foundation as a trusted and beneficiary-centric organisation with deep knowledge of supporting people with disability has helped us to successfully navigate the challenges that came following the COVID-19 pandemic. Our team's efforts to guide and support our beneficiaries and their families was indeed outstanding. We as a team faced several challenges but we continued to pursue our work with our students and families while not missing a step towards the achievement of our strategic plan and mission.

The Department of Differently Abled's effort was commendable to ensure the vaccination of non-ambulatory persons with disabilities vaccinated by healthcare professionals at door step of the beneficiaries. Some of my team accompanied the team during such visits.

Our Diploma in Special Education -Cerebral Palsy has been duly accredited by Rehabilitation Council of India for a period of 5 years starting from 2021 to 2026. The 5-year period of approval is a huge relief for organizations who are into teacher training as we do not have seek approval every 3 years.

80-G 5 (vi) of the Income Tax Act, 1961 SPASTN has received approval from Income Tax Department Ministry of Finance. Similarly, we have received approval under 12A from Assessment Year (AY) 2022-23 to AY 2026-27.

We received CSR1e the approval in April from the Ministry of Corporate Affairs under registration of entities for carrying out Corporate Social Responsibilities activities and this would be big step to seek support from potential CSR donors.

FCRA Renewal - On 9th December SPASTN was fortunate to receive the FCRA approval and renewed certificate is valid for a period of five years with effect from 01-01-2022.

With no support from Government of India we have been able to continue our services and programs with support from our various CSR partners. At present SPASTN have 21 students in this unit. 0-6 early intervention group has 2 students, 6- 18 years primary group has 19. From primary group, Miss.Priya and Janavi studying in class 5 and 3 at regular school. 20 parents joined in family network programme and 5 staffs joined in professional network programme. 15 severe db students are at Missionaries of Charity Shishubavan. Weekly once on Friday 1 special educator visit their homes and provide need based intervention. ▽

Autism:

There are 19 students attending this group. 3 – Students in Early Intervention group, 3 students studying in regular school. 13 students attending in bridge group. 9 nonverbal students communicate with their AAC boards and AVAZ. Brain gym, Drawing, Special education, Communication, Sensory integration, Music, group activities and Calendar system, shopping skills followed in this group. Next year 5 students promoted to skill training unit. 2 older students from this group transferred to SPASTN – Taramani, Naresh for Vocational training, Sudhan for NIOS 10th std.

MindTree Foundation – STEP project:

Blended Education for 60 children in Royapuram Centre received both special education and therapy services. The service provision is customized to every child and families are integral part of the service provision. The children under the program are given customized assistive devices, assessment for vision/hearing and also families supported with net pack support so that no child slips out without access to services.

Early Intervention Programme:

Play way method of teaching was introduced to the Early Intervention Group. At present we have 20 students in our EI group at the age of 1 to 6 years. All the students underwent medical intervention like Visual Screening, Auditory Screening and Neurological evaluation. They are getting physiotherapy or sensory integration, speech therapy and counseling and guidance. Introduce Singing and dancing, pre-writing skill, coloring work, Sitting tolerance, Activities for daily living activities and Attention span increasing activities given.

Primary Class:

20 students are studying in this group. From this group 3 students are studying in regular school. The entire students are getting holistic approach training. Apart from this they are learning cutting, pasting, folding the paper, Drawing, storytelling, group play, Music therapy, Sports activities and Computer class. Next year planning to send 2 students to Skill training unit.

Skill Training Unit:

There are 28 students in this group. 12 Boys and 14 girls are studying in this class. Both have separate class rooms. They are getting Special Education, Physiotherapy, Sensory integration, Communication, Time, Money, ADL Skills, Privacy and Sex education, Leisure time activities like dusting, cleaning of vessels, cooking and washing clothes, Shopping skill, Drawing and Painting, Dance, Sports & Craft work. Started Artificial Jewelry like Bangle, Chain, Hearings and Chocolate making etc. 3 students from this group studying in regular school. Planning to send Master. Lokesh to SPASTN – Taramani for vocational training. Master. B. Sanjay transferred to SPASTN Taramani for NIOS 10th Std.

REGIONAL LEARNING CENTRE – DEAFBLIND PROGRAM

DEAFBLIND REGIONAL CENTER FOR SOUTH (DbRC – SOUTH)

The Spastics Society of TamilNadu (SPASTN), Chennai is the Regional Learning Centre on Deafblindness – Southern region (TamilNadu, Telangana, Kerala, Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh, Puducherry) and “Sparsh” Services for Persons with Deafblindness and MSI in TamilNadu supported by Sense International (India) and funded by Azim Premji Philanthropic Initiatives (APPI).

Till January 2022 the impact of Covid and 3rd wave prevailed and gradually only from February 2022 regular physical mode of work opened up.
